


Fig. 2. A topographic map of the site of Amheida.
Contour interval 1 m. Survey of Amheida project, 2004.




Fig. 3. Amheida. Topographic map of 1930. Scale 1:10000.




Fig. 4. Amheida. Trucks of "free search" survey. 2005.




Fig. 5. Amheida. Topographical map, results of archaeological investigations and plots of magnetic survey 2000-2005.

Magnetic map of 2000. Contour interval 2 nT.




Figure 7 a. Amheida. Area A. Main or Temple hill.




Figure 7b. Amheida. Area A. Main or Temple hill.
Magnetic and interpretation map of 2000.




Figure 8 a. Amheida. Area A. Main or Temple hill.

Contour interval 2 nT. Scale 1:875





Figure 8 b. Amheida. Area A. Main or Temple hill.
Interpretation map.






Contour interval 2 nT.














Fig. 12. Amheida. Central ("Temple") hill. Area A.

Magnetic map. (Re-survey of 2005). Contour interval 3 nT.
















Fig. 17 b. Kellis.

Magnetic contour map. Contour interval 10 nT.








Fig. 19 Amheda, Area C. Northern-Eastern part of the town.
Magnetic grey scale map. Contour interval 3 nT.








Fig. 22. Amheida. Area D.

Contour interval 3 nT.




Fig. 23. Amheida. Area D.

Contour interval 3 nT.





Fig. 24. Amheida. Area D. Southern part of the town. Magnetic grey scale and interpretation map. Contour interval 3 nT.






Fig. 26. Amheida. Area E.






Fig. 26 a. Amheida. Area F.





Fig. 28. Amheida. Area F.

Contour interval 3 nT.






Fig. 29. Amheida.




Fig. 31. Amheida. Area G.

Contour interval 5 nT.





Figure 32. Amheida. Area G - South-West hill.
